

Horses Helping Humans - Videos required

For each Horse to be used in the delivery of the HHH program

Friendly - touch and rub horse all over on both sides	
Horse stays relaxed and adrenaline down	
Back up / call in	
Phase 1 backup	
Weight on hind quarters	
Horse stops just prior to line	
Step forward to stop	
Leading	
Good partnership	
Horse leaves calmly on suggestion only	
Breath out to stop, horses weight rolls back onto the hind quarters	
Figure of eight, no rushing and the facilitator remains in the driving space	
Circling - in both directions	
Back up to the end of the rope before circling	
Leave at a walk, with low head carriage and bending around circle	
Rump NOT facing into the middle of the circle at any time	
Transition from walk to trot with adrenaline down	
Transition from trot to walk with breath only	
Disengage to a stop from walk only	

On disengagement horse stays on the outside of the circle, facing in Human does not step backwards (unless specifically calling the horse in)

Jumping - in both directions

Human approx 1m from end of jump Only turns on a dime 1st time walk over jump Transition to trot, jump at trot calmly Transition to walk then stop calmly

Backing through " L" shape

Driving horse backwards without touch Rope not over-short
